DOTS

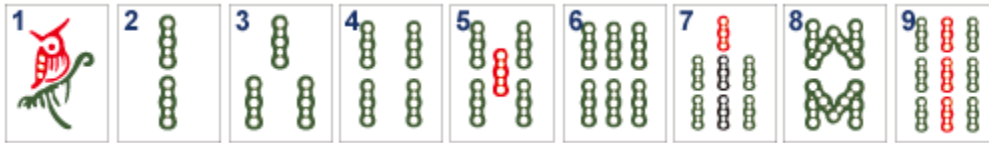
Images of dots, circles, or balls. Each Dot tile has a number stamped in the upper left-hand corner, indicating the number of dots on the tile. Numbers go from one to nine and there are four of each number for a total of 36 tiles.



BAMS

Bam is short for Bamboo. The tiles are mostly green and the images represent bamboo twigs. Like the Dots numbers are stamped in left-hand corner. Numbers go from one to nine and there are four of each number for a total of 36 tiles.

Special Note: In this suit the 1-Bam tile is an image of a bird. In older vintage sets the one bams are noteworthy and define the age of the set. *Making an association with the 1-Bam and a bird will help you remember this tile.*



CRACKS

Cracks are distinguished by a red Chinese character stamped on the bottom half of the tile. On the top half of the tile is the Chinese character for the number that each tile represents. Like the Dots & Bams, numbers are stamped in the left-hand corner. Numbers go from one to nine and there are four of each number for a total of 36 tiles.
